The program is designed to help teens develop strong leadership skills while positively influencing younger children and peers to live tobacco-free lifestyles. The conference will also prepare adults to be facilitators and mentors of a T.A.T.U. group in their school or community. Facilitators help teens develop and practice effective teaching skills. Teens create and present a tobacco-free message to younger children, peers and community leaders reinforcing their commitment to stay tobacco free.
